## **BabyBasics - Lent Giving 2020**

This Lent, we are supporting Baby Basics Chelmsford as part of our vision and aims to LOVE, GROW, and SERVE our Community. Last week we were delighted to be joined by Joelle Mortimer who, together with her husband and middle daughter, started Baby Basics Chelmsford. They had been praying for guidance about how they could best serve their community and heard about Baby Basics, which was founded in Sheffield in 2009 and has a vision based on Matthew 25:37 – 40 "Reaching out to the local community to help those in need ...". They took the idea to the Moulsham Lodge Methodist Church Council, where they worship, and were given the go-ahead to start in September 2019.

Baby Basics Chelmsford has been the quickest set up service and referrals from health care professionals are starting to come through thick and fast.

Baby Basics works with midwives, health visitors and other local organisations to provide Moses basket starter packs for those in need. They help vulnerable groups such as teenage mums, families on low income, and women fleeing domestic abuse and trafficking. Each Moses basket starter pack provides a safer place to sleep and is packed full of toiletries such as nappies, wipes, maternity pads, as well as blankets, towels and baby clothes. For some these are the only items they have for their child.

We asked Joelle how we can help and this is what she said:

#### How?

Pray for the project and the small Baby Basics team of helpers

Talk to friends and neighbours about Baby Basics

Donate items for the Moses basket starter packs (especially those items marked\* below)

Donate financially so that they can buy essential new items such as mattresses

## **Current Arrangements regarding Coronavirus**

You will have seen that Coronavirus is dominating the news at the moment and we are seeing a response that is unprecedented in recent history. We are putting plans in place to protect each other, following advice from the Church of England.

#### We continue with Sunday services but with a few precautions:

- 1. We continue to receive Communion in one kind (bread) with blessings available (no touch)
- 2. We continue to share the peace without shaking hands or touching each other
- 3. We will provide hand washing facilities and hand gel if possible.
- 4. We will not be serving refreshments after the service. We appreciate that this is a big thing and we are really sorry, the guidance from the Church is clear on this.

We have increased our cleaning schedule and the areas that are cleaned.

# We are asking you to help us and protect each other by:

- 1. Not coming to church if you are unwell, even if it is a cold, cough or runny nose and you believe it's completely unrelated. Please do let us know though so that we can support in other ways,
- 2. Washing your hands as soon as you come into church. Our plan is to ask everyone to come in the lobby door and go straight to the bathrooms on their way in.

Follow the NHS guidelines on Catch it, Bin it, Kill it and handwashing.

We have made the difficult decision to stop Saturday Coffee until we can safely resume.

We may at some point in the future be asked to stop gathering together. It may not happen and we pray it doesn't, but if it does we will put arrangements in place to help you to worship at home.

Please do talk to us if you have any concerns or worries. This is obviously very worrying for many but we have the opportunity to live out our faith by loving and caring for our neighbours and all pulling together.
