Parish Prayers inspired by Julian of Norwich

Hazelnut theology:

God also showed me a little thing, about the size of a hazelnut, in the palm of my hand; and it was round as a ball. I looked at it, trying to understand it, and thought ‘*What might this be?*’ And I was answered like this: ‘*It is everything that has been made*’. I was amazed that it could last, for I thought it might have collapsed into nothing, it was so little. And a voice spoke inside my thoughts: ‘*It lasts, and ever shall last because God loves it*’. And so everything exists because of the love of God. So in this little thing I saw three lessons. The first is that God made it, the second is that God loves it, and the third is that it is God who keeps it going.

God made it:

O LORD, you have examined my heart and know everything about me.

You know when I sit down or stand up.

You know my thoughts even when I’m far away.

You know everything I do.

Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too great for me to understand!

You made all the delicate, inner parts of my body and knit me together in my mother’s womb.

Thank you for making me so wonderfully complex! Your workmanship is marvellous – how well I know it.

You watched me as I was being formed in utter seclusion, as I was woven together in the dark of the womb. You saw me before I was born.

Every moment was laid out before a single day had passed.

How precious are your thoughts about me, O God. They cannot be numbered;

I can’t even count them, they outnumber the grains of sand! And when I wake up, you are still with me! (*Psalm 139*)

God loves us: Bible Reading

Reflection: Please reflect quietly on the wonder of our God who loves us more than we can imagine, and totally unconditionally

God keeps it going:

You prepare a feast for me in the presence of my enemies. You honour me by anointing my head with oil.

My cup overflows with blessings.
