and now dwell in the heavenly kingdom for ever.  
As we celebrate their joy let us bring to the Lord  
our sins and weaknesses,  
and ask for his mercy.

**Father eternal, giver of light and grace,  
we have sinned against you and against our neighbour,  
in what we have thought,  
in what we have said and done,  
through ignorance, through weakness,**

**through our own deliberate fault.  
We have wounded your love  
and marred your image in us.  
We are sorry and ashamed  
and repent of all our sins.  
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,  
who died for us,  
forgive us all that is past  
and lead us out from darkness  
to walk as children of light.  
Amen.**

May the Father of all mercies  
cleanse us from our sins  
and restore us in his image

**Praise to you, O Christ.**

**Sermon**

*At the end of the sermon there is a short period of quiet reflection.*

**The Apostles' Creed**

**We believe in one God, the Father almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.  
We believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,  
born of the Virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried;  
he descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again;  
he ascended into heaven,  
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,  
and he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

**We believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic Church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting.  
Amen.**

## Preparation of the Altar

*The table is prepared and the bread and wine are placed upon it.*

Blessed be God,  
by whose grace creation is renewed,  
by whose love heaven is opened,  
by whose mercy we offer our sacrifice of praise.

**Blessed be God for ever.**

## **Eucharistic Prayer E**

The Lord be with you.  
**and also with you.**

Lift up your hearts.  
**We lift them up to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**It is right to give thanks and praise.**

And now we give you thanks  
for the glorious pledge of the hope of our calling  
which you have given us in your saints;  
that, following their example and strengthened by their  
fellowship,  
we may run with perseverance the race that is set before us and with them receive the unfading  
crown of glory.

In communion with angels and archangels and all who have  
served you on earth and worship you now in heaven, we  
raise our voices to proclaim your glory, for ever praising you  
and *saying*:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,  
God of power and might,  
heaven and earth are full of your glory.  
Hosanna in the highest.  
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.  
Hosanna in the highest.**

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ,  
Our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit,  
that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us  
the body and blood of your dear Son.  
On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and,  
taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to  
them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you.  
Do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did; in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Jesus Christ is Lord:

**Lord, by your cross and resurrection  
you have set us free.  
You are the Saviour of the world.**

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with *Saint* ..... and all the saints to the feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ,  
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,  
all honour and glory are yours,  
O loving Father, for ever and ever.  
**Amen.**

## The Lord's Prayer

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray

**Our Father in heaven,  
hallowed be your name,  
your kingdom come,

on earth as in heaven.  
Give us today our daily bread.  
Forgive us our sins  
as we forgive those who sin against us.

## **Invitation to Communion**

Draw near with faith.  
Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you,  
and his blood which he shed for you.  
Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you,  
and feed on him in your hearts  
by faith with thanksgiving

*We receive communion.*

*During the distribution music will be played*

## **Prayer of Spiritual Communion**

*We are a community gathering together online as well as in church. A physical barrier to receiving Communion is no barrier spiritually and so we invite those who have not received the bread to join us in this prayer of spiritual Communion.*

**My Jesus, I believe that Thou art present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love Thee above all things and I desire Thee in my soul. Since I cannot now receive Thee sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. As though Thou wert already there, I embrace Thee and unite**

**myself wholly to Thee; permit not that I should ever be separated from Thee. Amen. (St Alphonsus)**

## **Prayer after Communion**

*Silence is kept. The minister may say a post communion prayer.*

*We pray together*

**God, the source of all holiness and giver of all good things:  
may we who have shared at this table  
as strangers and pilgrims here on earth  
be welcomed with all your saints  
to the heavenly feast on the day of your kingdom;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen**
