

Fairtrade Place of Worship

St Luke's is now a registered Fairtrade Place of Worship - look out for the posters so that visitors to our church will know. We have committed to using Fairtrade tea, coffee and sugar for refreshments - and we're on the look out for Fairtrade biscuits so let us know if you see any when you're shopping.



Where to Buy Fairtrade

The Fairtrade Mark is the only mark which gives the producer a guaranteed price for his produce and also ensures that as a group the producers receive a bonus known as the Social Premium which they use for the benefit of their whole community.

However, it is not always easy to find Fairtrade on the High St. So don't forget to look in your local Co-ops which have the widest range of Fairtrade goods. The Oxfam bookshop also stocks some Fairtrade products including Divine chocolate which is the only chocolate company partly owned by the cocoa farmers themselves. It is often possible to find Fairtrade elsewhere but you have to look around. Did you know for example that Marks and Spencer's have a surprisingly good selection of Fairtrade jams and marmalades?

Don't forget too if you are looking for a drink or a snack that Greggs has a policy of selling Fairtrade drinks and this even includes Fairtrade orange and apple juice!

Don't forget too with the approach of summer that most supermarkets stock Ben & Jerry's ice cream which all carry the Fairtrade Mark! It is a great way to support Fairtrade cocoa farmers and keep cool at the same time.

Finally there is of course a Fairtrade stall at Central Baptist Church every Tuesday morning in term time which runs from 9.30am to 12.30pm. Central Baptist is in Victoria Road South opposite County Hall. So if you are out shopping in Chelmsford on a Tuesday morning in term time, do look in and buy some Fairtrade. Everyone is welcome to a free sample of Fairtrade chocolate and you can also buy a cup of Fairtrade coffee at the church café.
