#### Psalm 79:1-9

<sup>1</sup>O God, the nations have come into your inheritance; they have defiled your holy temple; they have laid Jerusalem in ruins. <sup>2</sup> They have given the bodies of your servants to the birds of the air for food, the flesh of your faithful to the wild animals of the earth. <sup>3</sup> They have poured out their blood like water all around Jerusalem, and there was no one to bury them.

<sup>4</sup> We have become a taunt to our neighbours, mocked and derided by those around us. <sup>5</sup> How long, O LORD? Will you be angry for ever? Will your jealous wrath burn like fire? <sup>6</sup> Pour out your anger on the nations that do not know you, and on the kingdoms that do not call on your name. <sup>7</sup> For they have devoured Jacob and laid waste his habitation.

<sup>8</sup> Do not remember against us the iniquities of our ancestors; let your compassion come speedily to meet us, for we are brought very low. <sup>9</sup> Help us, O God of our salvation, for the glory of your name; deliver us, and forgive our sins, for your name's sake.

#### Matthew 21:33-end

<sup>33</sup> 'Listen to another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a fence around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a watch-tower. Then he leased it to tenants and went to another country. <sup>34</sup> When the harvest time had come, he sent his slaves to the tenants to collect his produce. <sup>35</sup> But the tenants seized his slaves and beat one, killed another, and stoned another. <sup>36</sup>Again he sent other slaves, more than the first; and they treated them in the same way. <sup>37</sup> Finally he sent his son to them, saying, "They will respect my son." <sup>38</sup> But when the tenants saw the son, they said to themselves, "This is the heir; come, let us kill him and get his inheritance." <sup>39</sup> So they seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him. <sup>40</sup> Now when the owner of the vinevard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' <sup>41</sup> They said to him. 'He will put those wretches to a miserable death, and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the harvest time.' <sup>42</sup> Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures: "The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; this was the Lord's doing, and it is amazing in our eyes"? <sup>43</sup> Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that produces the fruits of the kingdom.<sup>44</sup> The one who falls on this stone will be broken to pieces; and it will crush anyone on whom it falls.<sup>45</sup> When the chief priests and the Pharisees heard his parables, they realized that he was speaking about them. <sup>46</sup> They wanted to arrest him, but they feared the crowds, because they regarded him as a prophet.
