PCC Key Messages

The PCC met on Wednesday and share the following key messages:

- We considered the structural engineers report into our large hall ceiling, which is confirmed to be made from RAAC (reinforced autoclaved aerated concrete). There is some urgent work required to open the hall. Further work across the whole roof will be required within the next 12 months.
 We are looking into grants; we will need to raise funds.
- We are closely monitoring our financial position, which is impacted by the additional costs to investigate and resolve the immediate RAAC issues and subsequent loss of rental income with the closure of the large hall.
- Now that the car park steps have been removed, we are aware that
 people are walking over the steepest part of the slope. We are going to
 plant a large bush there to direct people away from this area on safety
 grounds. Please let Lucy or any PCC member know if you can help.
