⁴ He determines the number of the stars; he gives to all of them their names.

⁵ Great is our Lord, and abundant in power; his understanding is beyond measure. ⁶ The LORD lifts up the downtrodden; he casts the wicked to the ground. ⁷ Sing to the LORD with thanksgiving; make melody to our God on the lyre.

Luke 10:1-9

After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. ² He said to them, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. ³ Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. ⁴ Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. ⁵ Whatever house you enter, first say, "Peace to this house!" ⁶ And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. ⁷ Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the labourer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. ⁸ Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; ⁹ cure the sick who are there, and say to them, "The kingdom of God has come near to you."

Key Messages from the PCC

The PCC met on Wednesday evening and share these key messages:

- We are overwhelmed by the generosity of the congregation in responding to our plea to raise 50% of the total cost of the large hall roof work by the end of October, and are delighted to report that we have exceeded that target. We are now applying for large grants.
- We agreed to hold another ADVENTure event and Carol service on Advent Sunday, 1 December. If you could help with an activity, please let Lucy know. We also agreed to hold our Christingle service before Christmas this year; it will be held on Sunday 22 December at 10am.
- We planned a number of fundraising events for January - April 2025, including a Pudding Evening on Friday 7 February and a Table Top Sale on Saturday 1 March.
