2 Timothy 3: 14 - 4: 5

¹⁴ But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, ¹⁵ and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶ All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.

4 In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: ² proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favourable or unfavourable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. ³ For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, ⁴ and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. ⁵ As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.

Luke 18:1- 8

18 Then Jesus told them a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart. ² He said, 'In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor had respect for people. ³ In that city there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, "Grant me justice against my opponent." ⁴ For a while he refused; but later he said to himself, "Though I have no fear of God and no respect for anyone, ⁵ yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will grant her justice, so that she may not wear me out by continually coming.'" ⁶ And the Lord said, 'Listen to what the unjust judge says. ⁷ And will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them? ⁸ I tell you, he will quickly grant justice to them. And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?'

Eco Tip - Cleaning

Avoid using chemicals that can be harmful to the environment by using white vinegar as toilet cleaner. Pour a couple of teaspoons in the water, wait a couple of minutes then scrub and you should have the same effect as chemical cleaners.

Alternatively, invest in some eco-friendly cleaning products. Refill Town, the shop near the bus station, has a great supply. Here at St Luke's we have just switched to eco friendly liquid soap, toilet cleaner and floor cleaner.

PCC Key Messages

The PCC met on Wednesday and share the following key messages:

- We were really pleased with the number of responses to the Eco Church Lifestyle Survey. We looked at the results and identified two areas that you would like us to focus on over the coming months: carbon footprints and ethical finances. Watch out for more information soon.
- We have decided to switch our current account away from Barclays on the grounds of their poor ethical policies and investments. This is a significant decision. We will share more information about how we came to this decision and what it means as we work through the switch.
- We are planning three special services/events over Advent and Christmas and hope you will get involved: Christingle Service (Sunday 30 Nov at 4pm); Cakes and Carols (Saturday 6 Dec at 2.30pm) and a Nativity Trail with activities for families (Monday 22 Dec at 2pm).
- During Advent and Christmas we will again focus our giving on Next Chapter, who provide domestic abuse support services. Early next year we would like to commit to a three year cycle of support to a range of charities and will be asking for your ideas in January.
